## Your Stay

Richard Peck House can accommodate up to 30 people. The House has:

- Single, double and twin rooms all with en-suite facilities, tea and coffee making provisions and radio.
- Lounge with TV, video and music.
- Attractive dining rooms serving fresh local produce.
- Special diets catered for.
- Optional programme of outings in a comfortable, adapted minibus.
- Entertainment in the House.
- Bar.
- Small library and table games.
- Aromatherapy and beauty treatments available by prior arrangement.
- Smoking in designated areas.

## Extra Help

For those who need some extra help there are specially adapted rooms with level access showers. A care call system is fitted in all rooms and the first floor rooms are served by a lift. Personal care is available for those who need it and guests can borrow electric scooters if required.

If guests tell us in advance, the local District Nursing Service can continue the care that is currently being received at home, subject to agreement between the two services.
